Inclusion & Dyslexia Friendly Status Re- Accreditation

This year the school is working towards achieving our re-accreditation for Inclusion and Dyslexia Friendly Status. This is a nationally recognised award that is run in partnership with Dyslexia Cornwall.

What this involves and why this is important:

The IDFS process involves the school undertaking a whole school audit, which allows us check that throughout the school we are developing practice that is inclusive & dyslexia friendly- good practice that ultimately impacts upon the learning of all pupils. The audit includes looking at a number of areas including:

- Leadership & management,
- Staff training,
- Teaching & learning including assessment & planning & the school/ classroom environment and resources,
- Partnership with parents/ carers and
- Working in partnership with children/ young people.

The school last achieved this award in 2014 and it needs to be reviewed every 3 years. Therefore since September I have been working with the Cognition & Learning service to prepare our school for our accreditation on **Thursday 7**th **June 2018.**

Therefore the whole school will be working towards this IDFS re- accrediatation through:

- Whole school staff training, including governors on Monday 19th March
- Staff training within teacher staff meetings
- Updating the school website to ensure parents have access to information about Dyslexia and other potential barriers to learning
- Raising the children's awareness and understanding of differences & inclusion, through KS2 assemblies

We would like to involve the parents as much as possible in this process. We will be exploring the idea of developing a parental 'steering group' for this process, so if you think you could be involved with this could you give your name to Dot or email me on: michellebrant@st-hilary.corwall.sch.uk






