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### The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)

From May 25<sup>th</sup> the 'GDPR' is being introduced across the EU. Charlotte and I have attended a few training sessions on this to date and whilst we have some auditing and training to do around this, the vast majority of what is in the regulation is underpinned by sound data protection process already in place.

In school we have a statutory obligation to hold the vast majority of data that we do in order to fulfil our educational obligations. As far as children in the school are concerned, the two main lawful reasons for us holding or using data would be for Public interest (*most school processing*) and Consent (*sharing photographs, news stories*).

As we prepare for the new regulation we shall be auditing the data that we hold and our data protection processes with a particular focus on:

- Personal data we hold
- Where it came from
- Why it is needed
- Who it is shared with and why
- How long it is kept for
- How it is looked after

We envisage very little change following the audit as we are confident that we already have strong processes in place, but training for staff and checking procedures will be an ongoing element of the GDPR for us. Louise Greygoose will take on the role of Data Protection Officer and this will involve monitoring and checking school procedures for compliance.

### **How does this involve us as parents?**

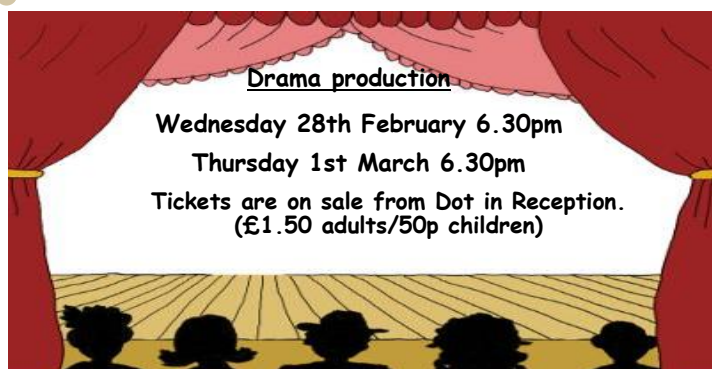
At this stage there are two things that we need to consider such as the use of photographs and emailing marketing materials.

In terms of use of photographs, you will recall completing a photograph permission form last term and this will be completed annually to give parents the opportunity to change a decision. However, changes can be made at any time and if you are ever unsure which options you have opted for, or would like to change your mind, then please do not hesitate to contact us.

Occasionally we send marketing materials to parents via email. Our school policy is that we only send out marketing for activities that we think children or parents may like to partake in eg. sport camps, local performances. In preparation for the GDPR we will be asking parents if they are happy to receive such marketing and those that choose to 'opt out' will be able to do so.

At the grand old age of 8 when I decided that I was going to be a primary school teacher I never envisaged that this would be an important part of my role, but with the way that the use of data and technology has changed so dramatically over the past few years I do fully support the review of our practices in order to ensure the safety of the children at all times. Over the next term, we will be re-writing our data policies and privacy notices and will ensure that these are signposted for you to read should you wish to do so.

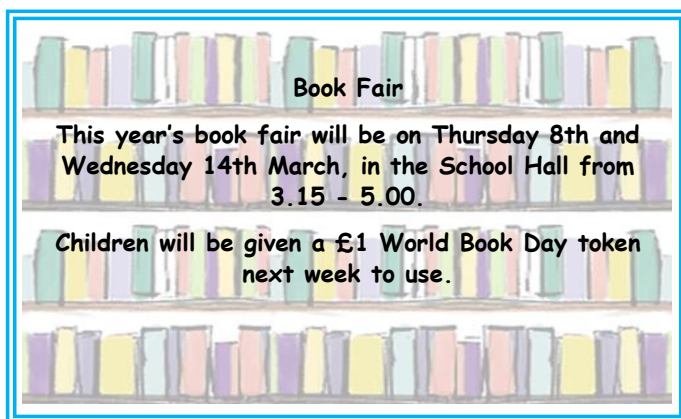
