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Inclusive, Dyslexia Friend Quality Mark

You may or may not be aware that for the past few years we have been assessed as holding the Inclusive, Dyslexia Friendly Quality Mark. Our stance on all quality marks and awards is that whilst it is always lovely to be awarded these, it is actually the process that goes into achieving the awards which is the most important. The process always involves a thorough evaluation of what we think we are doing well and what we think we need to work on, and this inevitably results in improvements- which of course benefits the children. This year we were due to review the quality mark and last week we were very happy to welcome our assessors, Morag from the Dyslexia Service and Jane Davidson from the Cognition and Learning Service.

Miss Brant did an excellent job of providing Jane and Morag with a large file of evidence alongside our own school evaluation as a starting point for the assessment. The assessment also included meetings with staff, children, parents and governors. (Thank you to the parents and governors who came in to speak on our behalf!). It was a pleasure to have Morag and Jane with us and they gave us some great feedback which will help us to plan ahead.

As a result of the visit, we are very pleased to announce that we have once again been awarded the Inclusive, Dyslexia Friendly Quality Mark! The full report is available on the school website, but a few of the highlights are:

"St Hilary has a warm, nurturing and positive ethos; this is evident through the whole school".

"Learners have positive attitudes to learning; this is evident both in and outside of the classrooms. There was a consistently positive atmosphere in classrooms and all learners were engaged in their tasks".

"Engaging displays highlighted the importance of developing self-esteem, confidence and resilience"

"There are high expectations for all learners, including those with SEND"

"Staff understand and really know their children.....emails and letters from parents of children who are now in year 7 highlight the success of the transition from St Hilary to secondary schools".

"Parents described the SENDCo as approachable; they knew where to go if they had concerns and felt confident that their concerns were listened to and resolved".

The areas for us now to consider are:

- Investigate ways of offering voice and text recognition software to pupils who find the writing process difficult
- Ensure consistency across the school in the use of buff paper and visual timetables.
- Find further ways to showcase to parents and the local community the good work that happens at St Hilary School on a daily basis!

We are really proud of the result of the accreditation and our staff should feel that this a good reward for the hard work and dedication that they put in to educating our children on a daily basis.
