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## Data Protection At St Hilary School

You are most probably aware that from May, the rules around data protection are changing. The 'General Data Protection Regulation' (GDPR) will change how we can use your personal data and keep it safe, and will also strengthen your rights over your own data.

The point of this is to make sure sensitive or private information about yourselves and your children stays safe. Whilst it is similar to the current Data Protection Act in many ways, there are a few differences, so we need to make a few changes at the school in order to ensure we remain compliant.

### **Privacy Notice**

One of these changes is that we have updated our privacy notice. I have attached a copy of the privacy notice to this newsletter which can also be found on our school website under GDPR.

### **Photograph and images consent**

At the beginning of this year, we completed photograph consent forms for all children at the school. However, parents have the right to give or withdraw consent at any time. If you do wish to change consent, this can be done by contacting the school office where you will be given a new form to complete. The form can also be found in the GDPR section on the school website.

### **School Newsletter**

As you will know, we currently email out our weekly newsletter. In our newsletters we like to include advertising or notices for activities available to children outside of school. This may include holiday activities, external sport clubs, community family events etc. The school does not receive any funds from the 'advertiser' but we feel that it is a positive thing to make families aware of activities that they, or their children, may like to take part in. The school uses its discretion about which advertising will be included but endeavors to avoid businesses or advertising where the advert is for personal profitable gain. Whilst the content of the newsletter will be no different to current practice, with the introduction of the GDPR, this could be considered 'marketing' so we are asking for parents to opt in or out of receiving the weekly newsletter. In order for us to collate this information, I have also attached a simple form to allow you to elect how you would like to receive the newsletter and in fact whether you are still happy to receive it. The newsletter will be available on the school website each week as it is currently.

### **Data Collection (ACTION NEEDED)**

On 24<sup>th</sup> April, all parents should have received an email from 'noreply@SIMS'. Up until now, we have sent home paper data collection sheets at the beginning of each year. This is to ensure that all the contact information and statutory information that we are asked to collect is accurate. This could be considered a data protection risk as the data sheets could go astray between school and home. Therefore, we will no longer be sending home data protection sheets but have set up our SIMS system so that parents can log in and change any of this data themselves.

**Please could all parents follow the links/ instructions in the email-** this will allow you to set up your secure SIMS account and keep us informed of any changes as and when needed (changes of phone numbers are the most common). If you do not wish to set this up, or are having difficulties logging in then please let us know and we can either support or update any information directly onto our system.

If you have any questions about how the GDPR affects you, or how our school is preparing, you can contact either myself or Charlotte Fraser (school business manager and deputy data protection lead) in the school office.

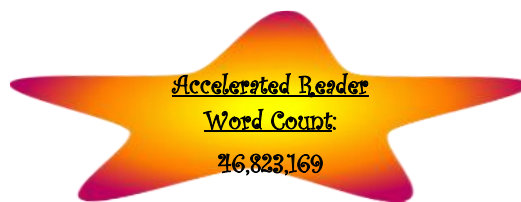

**A note to parents from the Team at Hayle Library**

Dear Parents,

I don't know if you are aware that there a lot of children that suffer during the school summer holidays from the absence of free school meals and breakfast clubs that are run during term time. In Cornwall in 2015 one foodbank alone provided 2,500 meals to children during the school holidays. An APPG (All Party Parliamentary Group) report into hunger in the school holidays found about 3 million children nationally were at risk of going without meals during the summer holidays. As I'm sure you'll agree these are really high figures that are quite upsetting to contemplate.

We as a library have decided to try and help the children in our community by having a 'Fill the Gap' collection during the month of June to help the foodbank feed our local children during the summer holidays. We would be very grateful if parents would help contribute any 'Breakfast or lunch perishable foods' to our collection at any point during June, you can drop it off at the library Mondays Wednesdays and Fridays 9.30-5pm and Saturday mornings 10.00-1.00pm, every small donation of food helps however small.
