

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Maths Update


With there only being one week left to go until half term, I wanted to update you with our priorities for Maths this year. It has been absolutely fantastic to see the children in all classes getting stuck into various Maths concepts and it seems that the teachers have been impressed by how well they have settled back into routines being ready and eager to learn! We were very conscious at the beginning of the Academic Year to identify ways in which we could support the children in 'catching up' and to recognise those that need extra support.



Throughout the year, children will be recapping and consolidating on previous learning before moving on to the current year's content. This is to ensure every child is ready to progress and are confident to tackle new learning. We are also well aware that all pupils need challenging tasks to engage with the content further and promote deep mathematical thinking.

Our priorities this year are:

- ◆ To ensure all children re-engage fully with the subject of Maths after the Coronavirus lockdown, developing in confidence, knowledge and skills in order to maximise progress
- ◆ To further embed our approach to teaching fluency in arithmetic skills so this is consistent across the school
- ◆ To ensure there are intrinsic opportunities to develop and apply reasoning and problem-solving skills across the Maths curriculum



Last year, we were developing the children's independent approach to reasoning and problem solving with teachers creating 'Dive Deeper' templates that pupils, who are ready to progress, can access in order to deepen their learning of concepts further. This year, we would like to embed this across the school and give all pupils intrinsic opportunities to grapple and problem solve with Maths. We are in the process of organising training for teachers to build upon ideas and resources to enhance a rich, effective 'mastery' curriculum.

With technology being a huge factor during lockdown, we are keen to carry on where the children left off developing their fluency in times tables on TTrackstars (which already seems to be a huge hit from Y2-Y6) and the use of Maths Shed to enable children to practice basic skills. We've been announcing weekly TTrackstars 'Class Champions' in our Zoom assemblies as well as in the newsletter to help motivate the children and are always looking for ways to promote independent learning.

As always, we appreciate your support in helping children with Maths at home whether this be through playing games, spotting Maths outside, encouraging high quality homework and facilitating the use of online platforms.

I am confident that the children are settling in well and that Maths remains a subject that children enjoy. Here's to another fantastic year of learning despite (I'm sure!) challenges along the way.
