Castle	A large building, in the medieval period with thick walls, battlements, towers, and a moat. Period of time	Castles are a type of home. The people who lived in castles were usually kings, queens or lords and their families. Castles were designed to keep the people inside safe and to stop enemies from getting in. Inside the castles walls was the bailey - the area where people lived and worked. 'Motte and Bailey' was the name given to the first real castles built in England. Motte means 'mound' and bailey means 'closed/fenced-in' land.
