THIS YEAR'S ACTION PLAN

Our targets this year continue from our previous actions, building onto work that we've done in the last few years. The Renewed Ofsted Framework has also been the catalyst for some of our ideas. At St Hilary, we have always been firm-believers that reading is fundamental for our children to go on to achieve success in their future lives and Ofsted has now authenticated this, placing a huge amount of emphasis on reading in the curriculum, particularly early reading and children reading for pleasure.

Our main aim for this year reflects this and the other two priorities build on it, ensuring that our children receive high-quality English teaching, interwoven within our exciting and inspiring curriculum.

AIMS:

1) READING

- a) further develop a positive reading culture by fostering a deep love of books
- b) make the most of opportunities to enhance our wider curriculum



2) WRITING/SPaG

ensure that units of learning are planned coherently and purposefully around quality texts, incorporating integrated opportunities for SPaG, reading comprehension and writing for a purpose



3) ORACY

further develop oracy skills by applying and embedding best-practice strategies in all areas of the curriculum



READING FOR PLEASURE



I'm sure you will have seen the social media posts about the amazing work of our Pupil Parliament and PTA in searching for new books for our school library and our classrooms. We are using the www.BooksforTopics.com booklists to ensure that our children have easy access to these high-quality texts: fiction, non-fiction and poetry. There are classics on the list (that you will have read when you were growing up!) and newer books that I'm sure are the classics of the future.



One of my first jobs this year was to make signs for each classroom door to indicate the current class reader in each class. I also had fun making Bitmojis of the staff to show the children that we still continue to read as adults. We want to be reading role-models for our children—so far, there's been lots of positive talk about it from the children.

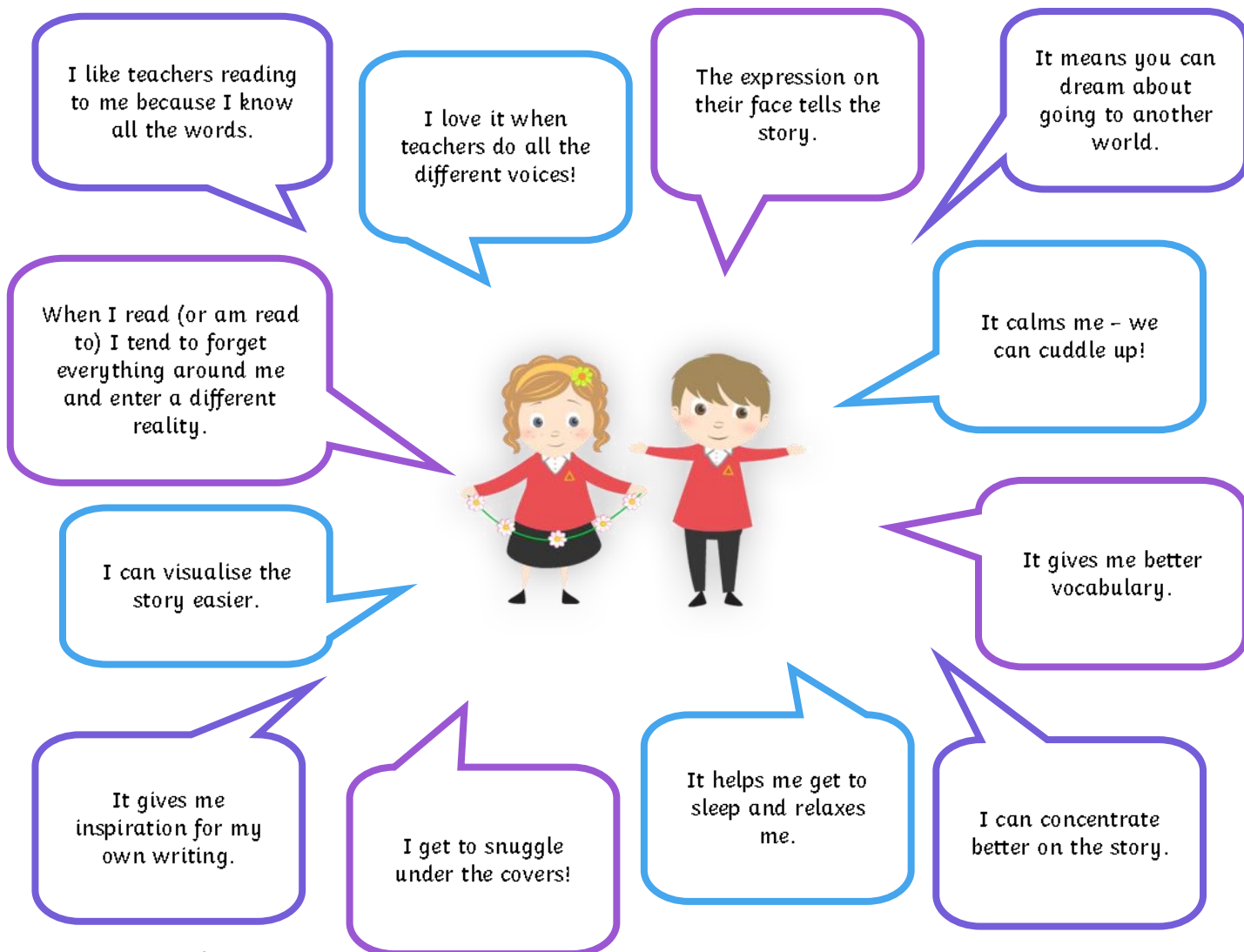
...RESULTS FROM PUPIL SURVEY

Main headlines:

- 89% of our KS2 children enjoy reading in school
- 76% can name 5 children's authors
- 99% of children think of their teacher as a reader
- 95% think that St Hilary is a 'Reading School'
- 92% see reading as 'cool'

PUPIL CONTACT INFORMATION

As you know we moved to the SIMS Parent Lite app for the purpose of complying with GDPR for collecting and managing pupil data from parents. What this means is that unless a parent comes in to request a paper copy of the data (the old data checking sheets) this is the only way we are informed of any changes.

In order to add/amend the information held for your child you will need to register for the app. This is done from an email that has already been sent, so if possible please could you register as soon as possible. If you have already registered, as a number of you have, **please do not go through the process again.**

The app is available on iOS, Android and a browser. The SIMS Parent Lite app provides a convenient and accessible solution for you to electronically review and request changes to the data held on your children.

Hopefully the instructions on the right will assist you with the process.

Step by Step – Parent and Student Registration

When the parent or student receives their invitation with instructions on how to confirm registration a link and code will be included.



You may want to provide the following instructions to help parents and students with the registration process.

1. Click the link within the email invitation sent by the school. A new browser window will open.
2. Under **Sign In With Account** select the appropriate platform for sign in. This depends upon the type of account the parent/pupil has chosen to use.



3. Enter the user's email address and then click **Next** or **Continue**.
4. Enter the associated password and click **Next** or **Continue**.
5. Enter the **Invitation code** supplied by the school, the **Date of Birth** of the parent or student, and click **Register**.
