The 'Real Authentic Project Based Curriculum' at St Hilary School

The rate of change of the educational vision of our government can be quite hard to keep up with sometimes but thankfully the latest change is, in our opinion, a positive step forward. From September, Ofsted will be shifting the focus from data and results to the provision of a really broad and balanced curriculum. Over many years we have strongly believed that whilst children do need to be strong in basic skills and knowledge, the curriculum should underpin a school's values and take our local environment into consideration. We believe that children should experience the widest possible range of experiences possible. The methodology behind our curriculum can be broken into 3 key areas: Intent, Implementation and Impact.

#### INTENT

Our intent is to deliver a leading-edge curriculum which is based on our 6 core values: Ethical, Excellence, Equity, Empathy, Endurance and Evolution. The curriculum is delivered through 'Real Projects' which begin with a driving question and finish with an authentic outcome. It is built on the age appropriate skills and knowledge needed whilst developing the key competencies of; thinking, self-management, working with others, using language, symbols and texts and active contribution. The curriculum entitlement is equitable for all, covers the wide range of subjects progressively and develops outcomes to the highest standards.



The curriculum is based on research. This has been based around the successes of 'High Tech High' in San Diego. We were fortunate to recently have the opportunity to welcome two interns from High Tech High to speak with our teaching staff, and as a result now have clear steps as to how we can develop the curriculum even further. Our more recent development has been to work towards a 3-16 curriculum following training from David Harris, author of 'Dropping the Batten'. We are excited about working with our partner Secondary and 'all-through' school to develop this.

#### IMPLEMENTATION

The use of '**Project Tuning Sessions'** in the planning stages, allows teaching staff to present their driving question, project milestones and ideas for authentic outcomes. This termly process provides peer critique, knowledge and idea sharing between staff. The impact has been the 'raised game' in curriculum delivery, the further development of positive working relationships and raised curriculum outcomes. These sessions have proven to 'raise the bar' and promote an element of risk taking.

**Curriculum creativity** for teachers and children, underpinned by rigorous progression of skills and knowledge. Teachers feel empowered and children are becoming increasingly resilient and creative. Creativity is seen in curriculum design and outcomes - in books and classroom environments.

**Excellent outcomes**, as seen in project books throughout the school. Children and staff are proud of their work. The introduction of these books has promoted a drive for excellence in line with our school presentation policy.

The proactive approach in **using local businesses and charities** within the curriculum and authentic outcomes, has built much stronger links with the local community and has provided the children with real life situations which has made their learning **purposeful and meaningful**.

The use of **peer critique** within the projects teaches children the skill of reflection. Learning to be 'kind, specific and helpful' enables the children to critique each other's work.

The curriculum provides opportunities for **collaboration, communication and critical thinking** right from project planning stage, through to the authentic outcome.

Use of 'project maps' to enhance parental engagement. These are completed at the beginning of each project and outline curriculum coverage and associated key events.

**Practical and memorable trips, visits and activities** where knowledge and skills are gained, feed the authentic outcome. Eg: Year 1/EYFS visit to an ice-cream shop/factory to design and make their own flavour. The children presented their design to parents and the local community, and the flavor was sold at the authentic outcome and in the shop! Year 6 dug a war trench as part of their WWI topic in order to build and experience empathy which led to excellent poetry writing and recital. Another group (led by the question 'have you ever been truly hungry?') studied homelessness and impact on society and then planned and completed a sponsored fasting activity. The funds raised were then used to buy sleeping bags and equipment which were then distributed to our homeless community.

Carefully mapped, inter-disciplinary learning, as a planned approach which uses links across different subjects or disciplines to enhance learning. It promotes the development and application of what has been taught and learnt in new and different ways. The recently formed partnership (Leading Edge Academies Partnership) allows for sharing of staff expertise, equipment and resources.

#### IMPACT

Following the completion of each project, the teachers and children evaluate and reflect on the project and the outcomes. This reflective approach gives time to celebrate successes and further develop the curriculum. As a result, teachers feel valued and empowered which in turn drives high quality learning. The use of 'Basecamp' to share plans and ideas promotes quality learning. Pupils are very proud of their work and understand how these skills will prepare them for the next stage of education. The authentic outcome gives children a real purpose for their learning.

The close and wider community is engaged and supports the projects eg. 'Shelterbox', parental support, local care homes, RNLI, 'Foodbank', local farmers market, 'Plastic-free Penzance'. This builds life-long links between our pupils and their community, and creates an understanding and appreciation of each other. Memorable experiences within projects build empathy and create happy and enthusiastic learners. The curriculum is extremely broad and sits within (and not at the expense of) a culture of daily miles, wide-ranging sporting events, visits, trips and school productions!




