

## CURRICULUM PROJECT OUTCOMES

Who can believe we're already at the end of the Autumn Term? With everything that has been going on this year, we felt it even more crucial to ensure the children are engaged in their learning by giving them rich experiences and opportunities that would strengthen their knowledge of the subjects but also ignite new passions.
As part of our Project Based Learning curriculum, each class has used their essential driving questions to inform and drive their authentic outcome. This year, however, options have been limited with the fact that the children cannot exhibit their work, get into the local community or celebrate their learning in the usual ways.
This term, many of the classes have decided to go digital so expect to see (if you haven't already) some wonderful creations in a varied way.

## Here is a breakdown of what each Year group will be sharing with you:

Rec/Yr. 1 - Our project outcome for Turrets and Tiaras is a medieval banquet on the 11th December. The children are dressing up as knights, kings, queens or fairy story characters and we will be hosting a jousting tournament using the hobby horses and shields they have made in DT. We are planning a grand feast followed by entertainment with jokes from a jester. Our essential question has been 'Is it always a happy ever after?' and we have learnt through history and fairy stories that it isn't always for everyone!

Yr. 2 - We will be creating a class video presentation of our termly learning.
Yr. 3 - Our project outcome (both classes) will be a video detailing how we have brought legends to life, sharing our work with children talking about their own learning in a variety of ways.

Yr. 4 - We will be making a Padlet of children's work for parents to see - expect all things Roman! The children have worked so hard and have been thoroughly engaged by this topic.

Yr. 5 - Our outcome is a presentation by each child answering our Essential Question - Vicious Vikings: Fact or Fiction? The children will be videoing themselves answering the question and presenting their work on Padlet.

Yr. 6 - The children have written emotive WW1 poetry which will hopefully be displayed in an interactive PDF. Each child will video themselves reading their poems - you may need to get tissues at the ready! Through trench digging and learning about historical events in great detail, they have a far greater knowledge to answer the questions: Can war ever truly be great?

Last week, the teachers showed great Endurance and Evolution themselves by giving a CPD presentation to the five schools within our MAT (Leading Edge Academies Partnership) based on 'Creating a curriculum we're proud of'. The team, through their usual high-standards and excellence, spoke passionately about how we have driven our curriculum forwards over recent years and how we strive to improve it even further. It is clear that the standards of teaching and learning continues to be a strength of St Hilary School and the children's learning is evident of this. In the future, we would like to share our curriculum developments with you further so you have a clearer understanding of how we go about designing it in the way that we do.

Despite it being a busy end to the term, the teachers will be getting together to critique each other's project ideas for NEXT term so that we can get 2021 off to a fantastic start. It is always a great opportunity to share creativity, work collaboratively and support each other. We look forward to constructing more exciting and inspiring projects in the hope that we can continue to provide the highest quality curriculum possible.

Whilst this term has been different in the fact that the children have not had many trips or classroom visits compared to previous years, we feel sure that they have truly enjoyed what they have been learning and hope that they have made life-long memories and work to be proud of!

A huge thank you must go to all the teachers and support staff for everything that they do but also we're grateful to you as parents who support us in the way that you do.
