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St Hilary has Achieved the Naace Mark!

On Wednesday the 3rd July we had an assessor from Naace, (National Association of Advisors for Computers in Education) to review our school for this Naace mark. This was previously called the ICT mark. The school achieved this mark again, making it the 4th time in a row that the school has been recognised as being excellent in education technology.

To achieve this, a self-review framework has to be completed and every part of technology use throughout the school is written down and evaluated, giving the school a level. Once at the required level, the assessor is contacted and a visit is arranged.

As the assessor walked around the school, he couldn't compliment us more on the school and the children's learning with and without technology. The children demonstrated their skills and knowledge in this area as he visited each classroom. It's only when you have a visitor like this, do you fully understand how ICT is so embedded into our school day and is taken for granted.

I was in the room when a small group of children were interviewed about their use of technology. Even the youngest children understood and could talk about how to stay safe when online. When the assessor asked if anyone was on Facebook, one Year 1 child said she was on Facebook, but luckily her sister put her straight and said, 'No you're not on it but there is a picture of you on it.' Of course, the older children knew that you have to be at least 13 years old to have a Facebook account.



I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the teachers, governors and parents who helped on the day. You are an amazing team to work with, and even at the end of a busy term you still showed your enthusiasm and expertise to reinforce the self-review that I had written on behalf of the school.





A small section of the Naace report follows:

"The long-standing Headteacher is an education technology enthusiast of the highest order and this is the school's fourth Naace/ICT Mark award: The Headteacher and governors are strong believers in the use of IT as both a learning tool and in equipping staff to fulfil their roles. The computing leader has also been in charge of her area for many years and is recognised throughout the school as first-class. The school has used the new SRF criteria: the SRF evidence has been written as extensive strand note statements."

"IT is an essential part of day-to-day life in our school. The school tour is a delight: everywhere, education technology is being used to support learning across a wide variety of topic/thematic areas by all of the staff: amazingly, every member of the teaching staff and most of the support staff were working in the school at the time of the previous assessment visit so it was very much "déjà vu" except that even more is being accomplished by this passionate group of educationalists than hitherto.

The children obviously relish their use of the wide range of education technology tools available to them and there is a seamless link between the various types of mobile device (laptop, iPad, Chrome) in evidence as well as the more practical examples of education technology from Beebots to Lego models to web-based literacy and numeracy programs."

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
