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English at St Hilary-2019 update

Before writing this, I read the article I wrote for last year's English update – I can't believe that it's already a year since I wrote it, and I am really proud of the progress we've made on the targets from last year's Action Plan.



This year's targets build on from last year's and can be summarised as follows:

Priority 1: Writing - raise levels of attainment and progress in writing, closing the gap between boys and girls

Priority 2: Writing – develop the assessment of writing throughout the school

Priority 3: SPaG – raise attainment, particularly at Greater Depth

Priority 4: Reading - continue to nurture tenacious, responsive, creative and motivated readers

Writing and SPaG (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar)

Personally, the teaching of writing is one of my favourite things to teach, yet it continues to be one of the subjects that our children find most tricky. There are a lot of reasons for this, and there isn't really a quick-fix. In most of the children's learning, they are concentrating on one or two smaller aspects of the subject, but in writing, they are generally using the whole 'kit and caboodle'! There is an awful lot for them remember!

To support this, the teachers worked together last term to come up with 'no excuses' pages for each year group – things that they **must, should** and **could** include in their writing. The children use these independently in their writing lessons (and across the curriculum) to ensure that their writing is always 'the best it can be'.

On Monday, we held a joint staff meeting with Ludgvan School to moderate samples of writing together, ensuring that our judgements tally. We all found it really useful and will definitely be making this a regular activity on our calendar.

Alongside all of this, we are also working on developing our teaching methods (linked to research) where we are using more opportunities to link to our class readers to teach reading, writing and SPaG, putting the purpose and audience of writing at the very heart of what we do.

Reading



We have always worked incredibly hard on developing the mechanics and love of reading here at St Hilary. Accelerated Reader continues to be used once children are 'fluent' readers, having a big impact on progress and attainment, particularly in supporting children through the transition from smaller, 'skinny' books to chapter books and beyond.

To support the development of reading, the children also have reading journals in their classrooms, our language when teaching reading skills is consistent across the school, applying the VIPERS acronym (vocabulary, inference, prediction, explaining, retrieving and summarising) and we are very lucky to have such generous parents in providing donations towards set of whole class readers. My class are currently loving The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe! Thank you for your generosity!

World Book Day 2019 – Thursday 7th of March

This year, we thought it was time for another day of fancy-dress! Get thinking about your children's costumes nice and early and we'll have a day of reading-fun on the 7th of March.

Car Parking


