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Without trying to sound too much like a cliché - I can't believe that this year is flying by so quickly and that we are now half way through the academic year. We must be having fun!

One of our key school development areas this year is to "effectively manage the transition into the 'Leading Edge Academy Partnership', ensuring a positive impact on the outcomes of pupils and staff, providing a world class education for global learners". Whilst this work is ongoing it continues to progress well, and we are currently looking at a conversion date of 1<sup>st</sup> April 2019.

Whilst this is the legal date for conversion, in reality the schools have been working more and more closely together as we have neared the conversion date. This work has included:

- Working with teachers from the other schools to form research circles. This is with the aim of developing key areas of interest in the schools and to look for opportunities for joint projects. So far this has included the curriculum, communications, physical education and maths.
- Joint writing moderation and classroom environment quality assurance with Ludgvan School.
- Planning a 'Regatta' where children across the partnership will have the opportunity to compete in paddle boarding, kayaking and raft making and we hope to be able to enter the 'Otillo' event on the Isles of Scilly again this year.
- My work on the Isles of Scilly has been a great way to share the good practice at St Hilary whilst picking up some good ideas and form links between teachers.

And last but certainly not least:

• Agreement on a core set of values. One of the very first jobs that we achieved in the early stages of the partnership was to agree these. It was imperative that the values reflect the ethos and ambitions of all of the schools, and the finalised values (the 6 E's) are:

Endurance – 'working hard and not giving up when things get difficult'.

Ethical - 'doing the right thing'.

Equity – 'fairness and social justice'.

Empathy – 'caring for others'.

Excellence – 'outstanding quality'.

Evolution - 'continuous change'.

At St Hilary, these values are reflected in our 'whole child' badges under the headings: Kindness consideration and respect, Academic, Creativity and Healthy Living. These values underpin our curriculum both inside and outside of the classroom and back up our vision that all children should have fun experiencing a broad and wide range of experiences and working at being 'the best they can be'. In other words...having a really good go!


We believe that this is an exciting time for St Hilary where we can work within a great wider team to continue to enjoy, and at the same time improve our school.


